# What to know, how to watch Wings at NAHL Robertson Cup

Still the reigning champions of the North American Hockey League, the Aberdeen Wings return to Blaine, Minn., this weekend to defend their title. ● That would be the 2019 Robertson Cup championship. Last year, the NAHL season ended abruptly courtesy of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Wings were leading the Central Division, but there were no playoffs. ● Aberdeen will enter the Robertson Cup Championship semifinals as heavy favorites in their best-of-three series against the Minnesota Magicians. During the regular season, the Wings won an impressive 51 of 56 games. The Twin Cities-based Magicians, meanwhile, split their 48 regular-season games and finished third in the Midwest Division. ● The Midwest Division playoffs were filled with upsets, and the Magicians are still standing. ● The Wings set NAHL records for team wins and points in a season. But, they have been tested in the postseason, winning an opening-round playoff series against Minot in a decisive fifth game that went into overtime. ● Kyle Gaffney scored the winner with 19.5 seconds left in the first OT. ● What could have been a crushing end to a historic season instead served as an exercise in adversity.
